As is the tradition for Nowruz, we set up a table called 'Haft-Sin' with the following items on it:

Sabzeh – wheat, barley or lentil sprouts growing in a dish Samanu – a sweet pudding made from wheat germ Senjed – the dried fruit of the oleaster tree Sîr – garlic Sîb – apples Somaq – sumac berries Serkeh – vinegar Sonbol – the fragrant hyacinth flower

Haft-Sin, also known as Haft-Seen, is a beautiful and meaningful Persian New Year tradition. It's a symbolic display of seven items, each starting with the Persian letter "sin," which represents the seven creations and seven holy immortals in the Iranian religion
